Data Protection Policy

Friends of Par Beach is a privacy conscious organisation and is strongly committed to your right to privacy. Our Data Protection Policy follows guidelines set out in the Data Protection Act 2018.

The Data Protection Act 2018

The Data Protection Act 2018 sets out rules for processing personal information and applies to structured paper records as well as data held on computers. With the Freedom of Information Act 2000 which came into force on 1 January 2005, the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018 will apply to all records, including those structured other than by reference to the data subject, and completely unstructured files.

Storage of Data

The Data Protection Act states that those who record and process personal information must be open about how the information is used, and must follow the principles of 'good information handling'.

These principles state that data must be:

- Used fairly, lawfully and transparently
- Used for specified, explicit purposes
- Used in a way that is adequate, relevant and limited to only what is necessary
- Accurate and where necessary, kept up to date
- Not kept for longer than is necessary
- Handled in a way that ensures appropriate security, including protection against unlawful or unauthorised processing, access, loss, destruction or damage
